Many people get confused with the difference between Great Britain and the United Kingdom. Hopefully, by the end of this class you will understand the difference.

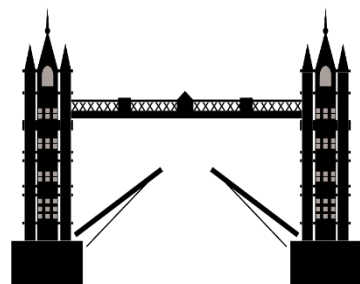
Great Britain

This includes three countries:

- Scotland
- Wales
- England

If you visit these places you can call the local people **British**. However, they also have their own nationalities. See below:

Country	Nationality
Scotland	Scottish
Wales	Welsh
England	English



The United Kingdom

This includes four countries:

- Northern Ireland Scotland Wales England

The UK means 'The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland'. The U.K was created in 1801 when Northern Ireland became part of Great Britain. If you visit Northern Ireland, it is suggested that you call them **Irish**, and not British.

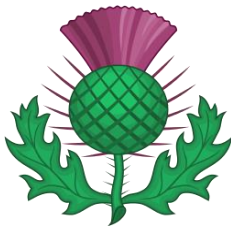

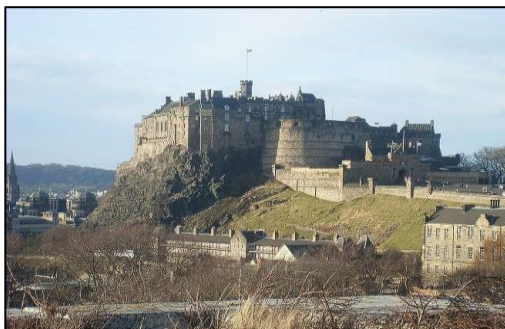
